



Growth in Q1 2012 sales

Temp. business: International sales multiplied by two

In Q1 2012, Group Crit sales amounted to €350.3 million, up 5.2 % compared to Q1 2011. At constant scope, sales amounted to €324.9 M€ vs. 333 M€ in Q1 2011.

Temp. business: up +3.4%

In Temp.business, Q1 2012 sales rose by 3.4% to €289.7 million.

This growth is sustained by international sales multiplied by more than two in Q1 2012 and amounting to €45 million (vs. €19.6 million sales in Q1 2011). This strong evolution benefited from the activity of the North American staffing company PeopleLink that confirmed its dynamic with sales up almost 9% at constant currency. At constant scope, international sales were up 3.8% in Q1 2012.

In France, Q1 2012 sales amounted to €244.7 million vs. €260.6 million in 2011. This evolution, in line with the French market, has to be compared with a high comparison basis, the first quarter 2011 sales increasing by +27,7%.

Multiservices business: up +15.4 %

Multiservices business realized an excellent first quarter with sales increasing by 15.4% to €65.1 million. This strong evolution stems from all business segments. In Airport activities, Q1 2012 sales were up 10.1% to €46 million. Engineering and Maintenance activities confirmed their dynamic with sales amounted to €14.7 million, up 30.3%.

This beginning of year in line with expectations, confirms the relevance of the Group strategy to strengthen its positions both in terms of implantations and expertise.
